

READING THROUGH LUKE – WEEK 1

<p><u>Sunday 6th February - Luke 1.1-4</u> In these verses Luke explains why he wrote the gospel. But why are you reading it? What do you hope to gain from Luke's intention?</p>	
<p><u>Monday 7th February – Luke 1.5-25</u> What was it about Zechariah that prepared him for this message? How prepared are we to hear from God?</p>	
<p><u>Tuesday 8th February – Luke 1.26-38</u> In what ways does the response of Mary at verses 34 & 38 differ from that of Zechariah in verse 18? How might we respond when God suggests the impossible?</p>	
<p><u>Wednesday 9th February – Luke 1.39-56</u> What reaction do we observe from Elizabeth and then Mary to the coming of Jesus? How do we react to the recognition of His presence with us?</p>	
<p><u>Thursday 10th February – Luke 1.57-66</u> Reflect upon the reactions of neighbours and relatives to God's blessing upon Elizabeth and Zechariah. How might we react to being the centre of such attention?</p>	
<p><u>Friday 11th February – Luke 1.67-80</u> Think about the key words of redemption, salvation, mercy, covenant, oath, holiness, righteousness, forgiveness Do we understand these words? If not, ask someone about them this weekend</p>	
<p><u>Saturday 12th February – Luke 2.1-7</u> Joseph journeyed around 80 miles from Nazareth to Bethlehem. How far are we prepared to put ourselves out to learn about Jesus?</p>	
<p><u>Sunday 13th February – Luke 2.8-20</u> The familiar Christmas Story draws to a close. Have you followed Mary's reaction in v19?</p>
