

READING THROUGH LUKE – WEEK 2

<p><u>Monday 14th February – Luke 2. 21-40</u> What might it mean for us to wait upon the Lord, as Simeon did? In what ways does Jesus “cause the falling and the rising of many” amongst those who profess His name?</p>	
<p><u>Tuesday 15th February – Luke 2. 41-52</u> As with many worshippers at Park, Jesus was in no hurry to leave God’s house – but what was the nature of His conversation?</p>	
<p><u>Wednesday 16th February – Luke 3. 1-20</u> John pulled no punches as he preached – and as a result, people began to wonder whether he was the Christ. How might we be more complete in our proclamation of the gospel?</p>	
<p><u>Thursday 17th February – Luke 3. 21-37</u> In what ways does our life story read like a family history programme – and in what ways has it been transformed by an infilling of the Holy Spirit, assuring us of our heavenly parentage?</p>	
<p><u>Friday 18th February – Luke 4. 1-13</u> Jesus responded to temptation by quoting Scripture. Might our immersion in Luke’s Gospel cause Satan to rethink?</p>	
<p><u>Saturday 19th February – Luke 4. 14-30</u> Why, in Nazareth, did those who initially spoke well of Jesus and His message (v22) then turn against Him (vv28-29)? How prepared are we to receive <u>whatever</u> Jesus says?</p>	
<p><u>Sunday 20th February – Luke 4.31-44</u> In Capernaum, the people were again amazed (see verses 22, 32, & 36) but they welcomed Jesus’ teaching and overwhelmed Him! How might we respond when the calls upon us outstrip our capacity?</p>
